This mixture is loaded with color to attract butterflies and hummingbirds.

Ingredients: Calendula Mix, Bachelor Button, Shasta Daisy, Godetia, Godetia Clarkia Mix, Plains Coreopsis, Cosmos Sensation Mix, Larkspur, Purple Coneflower, Indian Blanket, Baby's Breath, Sunflower, Perennial Lupine, Corn Poppy, Gloriosa Daisy, California Poppies

This mixture contains specially selected long-stemmed varieties of wildflowers that are excellent for a "cutting garden".

Varieties in this mix bloom over a long season, from spring through late summer. Western Pride Cut Flower Mixture will do best in full sun, but it will perform in partial shade, at least 8 hours of sunlight per day.

Different species not only flower at different times, but at different heights, creating a pleasing, colorful effect.

Planting Instructions: sprinkle seeds evenly over a loose seedbed using your hand in early spring. Be careful to distribute the seeds evenly and not to thick. Water the seed bed gently.

Soil Facts: Requires a well prepared soil. Use general purpose fertilizer when preparing soil. Germination: 15 to 25 days at 70°F.

Low-Grow Wildflower Mixture contains both annuals and perennials--none of which grow taller than twelve inches! The quickly establishing annuals will head off weeds while the hardy perennial will germinate more slowly and become established. Perfect for large scale meadow plantings, borders, or even as fill-in plantings throughout your garden, this mixture prefers full sun. Flowers in this mixture are very attractive to butterflies; reseeds readily for year-after-year beauty. Planting Instructions: sprinkle seeds evenly over a loose seedbed using your hand in early spring. Be careful to distribute the seeds evenly and not too thick. Water the seed bed gently. Soil Facts: Requires a well prepared soil. Use general purpose fertilizer when preparing soil. Germination begins: 15-25 days at 70°F. Ingredients: California Poppy, Mission Bells Poppy, Corn Poppy

Poppin' Poppies wildflower mixture is a beautiful very bright combination self-seeding annuals. The poppies are single and double blooms in red, orange, pink, white, salmon and yellow. If planted in mass, **Poppin' Poppies** will appear as flowing meadows of bright color. **Poppin' Poppies** can be planted on sunny hillsides, vacant lots, parking strips, golf courses, along drives, country gardens, home flower gardens in the plains and high mountain areas of the west. The poppies are of varying height. **Poppin' Poppies** prefers full sun and well drained, fertile soil. Sow the seeds where they are to grow, as they are difficult to transplant.



Soil Facts: Requires a well prepared soil. Use general purpose fertilizer when preparing soil. Germination begins: 15-30 days at 70°F. Planting rate 1 to 2 ounces per 125 square feet. 1 pound covers 2,000 square feet for a meadow appearance. Heavier rates can be used for concentrated plantings. Keep the seed bed moist until germination is complete and the poppy plants are established.

Ingredients: Columbine, Bachelor Button, Siberian Wallflower, Shasta Daisy, Plains Coreopsis, Sulfur Cosmos, Sweet William, African Daisy, California Poppy, Blanket flower, Baby's Breath, Blue Flax, Alyssum Tall White, Evening Primrose, Shirley Poppy Singles, Rocky Mountain Penstemon, Prairie Coneflower, Catchfly, Black-Eyed-Susan

Western Pride Wildflower Mixture is formulated to blend into the natural landscape and environmental conditions of the high plains and mountainous regions of the west. This mixture does not contain any filler, including grass seed or inert ingredients. This beautifully colored perennial and annual wildflower mixture was blended to provide a kaleidoscope of colors with differentiating heights throughout the growing season.

Planting Instructions: sprinkle seeds evenly over a loose seedbed using your hand in early spring. Be careful to distribute the seeds evenly and not too thick.

Water the seed bed gently. Soil Facts: Requires a well prepared soil. Use general purpose fertilizer when preparing soil. Germination begins: 15-25 days at 70°F. Planting rate 1 to 2 ounces per 125 square feet. 1 pound covers 2,000 square feet for a meadow appearance. Heavier rates can be used for concentrated plantings. In the fall after the seed heads have formed on the flower heads, run a lawn mower or a string weed cutter over the flower bed, to redistribute the seeds. Fertilize each fall and spring.

Western Pride California Poppies

This bright, orange and yellow poppy is unsurpassed for naturalizing, meadows, sunny hillsides, dry fields, vacant lots, country and city gardens in the plains and high mountain areas of the west. **California Poppies** readily reseeds year after year. The flowers arise from a free branching, feathery, glue-green foliage base. Growing about 12 inches tall, bearing satiny blossoms 2 inches across, in shades of bright yellow to deep orange. **California Poppies** prefer semi-arid to arid areas, full sun and well drained soil. Sow the seeds where they are to grow, as they are difficult to transplant. Soil temperatures should be at 60 degrees or higher. Planting rate 1 to 2 ounces per 125 square feet. 1 pound covers 2,000 square feet for a meadow appearance. Heavier rates can be used for concentrated plantings. Keep the seed bed moist until germination is complete and the poppy plants are established. **California Poppies** do not require supplemental water during the summer unless it is exceptionally dry and windy.

Western Pride Blue Flax

Blue Flax is a feathery annual flower that is tufted with slender leafy stems that develop loose, multi-branch clusters of small delicate sky blue flowers with small yellow eye. The flowers will bloom from May through October and the plant is very fast growing.

The flowers are funnel-shaped when they open in the morning, flatten out during the day and are dropped the following day leaving a green seed capsule. Even though the flowers last only a day, they are born in such profusion all summer long the plant is constantly covered in color.



Blue Flax is a drought tolerant wildflower that grows naturally in the western states, preferring prairies, open rocky woods, mesas, dry hillsides, coniferous forests and meadows. Blue flax grows 12 to 30 inches high at elevations up to 9,000 feet.

Blue Flax shows moderate tolerance to saline or alkaline soils, does best in a soil with a pH of 5.0 to 7.5. Blue Flax prefers full sun on sandy or rocky soils.

Blue Flax is often found in western wildflower mixtures because of its profusion of color and its ability to self-sow each season. Full grown plants do not transplant well.

Sow the seeds where they are to grow, as they are difficult to transplant. Soil temperatures should be at 60 degrees or higher. Planting rate 1 to 2 ounces per 125 square feet. 1 pound covers 2,000 square feet for a meadow appearance. Heavier rates can be used for concentrated plantings. Keep the seed bed moist until germination is complete and the Flax plants are established.

Blue Flax (*Linum lewisii*) was discovered by Meriwether Lewis on the Lewis and Clark Expedition in the late 1700's.
